THE NEW CLUB YEAR

2012 ANNUAL EVENTS

For all those new members of the club we hold a number of events throughout the year. In 2012 these will be as follows. These will be held as follows:

LAYOUT ACTIVITY

N gauge group - Basingstoke enjoyed a good operating session at the open day, with most of the new electrics now behaving as anticipated and just a few issues left to resolve. Unfortunately, moving the layout about proved the final straw for the canopy on the down platform, so the renewal of that that is a task we will need to look at before its next outing to Stafford in February next year.

Now we have work on Basingstoke more or less complete, thoughts will turn more to the planning of Wickwar's baseboards.

OO gauge group - Greenfield Sidings was on show at the club open day, a few usual niggles but we still had some budding operators trying their skills under the watchful eye of Terry Hillyer. In between he has been planting trees on the layout to fill a few gaps. I wonder if he can plant telegraph poles - after all they are made of wood as well.

The Isle of Wight visit is this coming weekend, the theme is Southern and BR(S) to keep it local. We have also been invited to Christchurch (Bournemouth) next October so it's going to be a busy time.

P4 gauge group: Our second public outing for Brixcombe at the club's exhibition meeting allowed us to thoroughly test the track changes made since the layouts debut at Bristol in June. Running was much improved, justifying the decision to relay the offending sections. During the exhibition we started to encounter problems with polarity switching through the tortoise point motors. Thanks to a timely repair by Pete Smith, we were able to get to the end of Sunday with no significant problems but we have decided to move away from reliance on the internal electrical connections in the tortoise to externally fitted micro switches, as used on Weydon Road.

The exhibition also allowed the P4 gang of five to (re-)familiarise themselves with the operation of Brixcombe. This has led to discussions on possible changes to certain aspects of the layout. A plan for completing the layout and fixing any remaining issues has been drawn up and issued. Work has already commenced and it is hoped to have it completed by end of Q1 2012.

Many visitors made positive comments about the layout and a couple of tentative enquiries were received regarding exhibiting it elsewhere.
